LISTENING SKILLS

Here are some suggestions on how to present yourself when meeting with a member of your congregation.

- 1. Sit slightly forward.
- 2. Maintain an open, relaxed posture.
- 3. Listening may be more than just hearing the words being said; hear me, not only with your ears, but also with your eyes, touch and your heart.
- 4. Look into their eyes, but take your cue from the person you are speaking with. (Different races and cultures may consider eye contact impolite or even disrespectful.)
- 5. Reflect what the person is saying to you.
- 6. While meeting with a person in pain or distress you are Jesus in the Flesh to them.
- 7. Always maintain confidentiality.
- 8. Both open and close with prayer.

WHAT A FELLOW CHILD OF CHRIST WANTS WHEN THEY REACH OUT TO YOU

- 1. I want you to call me and let me know I exist.
- 2. Tell me you are there and that you care.
- 3. Ask how I feel and then let me tell you how I feel.
- 4. Let me express my anger and loneliness, and let me cry if I need to.
- 5. Ask me if I want to be touched with a hug or a prayer, and then let me decide; when I say no accept it, when I say yes do it.
